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REFERENDUMS

Rock County

Question: Shall the County of Rock, adopt the following resolution?

Resolved, that "We the People" of the County of Rock, Wisconsin, seek to reclaim democracy from the expansion of corporate personhood rights and the corrupting influence of unregulated political contributions and spending. We stand with communities across the country to support passage of an amendment to the United States Constitution stating:

1. Only human beings are endowed with constitutional rights - not corporations, unions, nonprofits or other artificial entities, and
2. Money is not speech, and therefore regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting speech.

Question: Shall the Town Board adopt an ordinance changing the size of the Town Board from 3 supervisors to 5 supervisors?

City of Evansville

Question 1: Should the Evansville Common Council, as the representatives of the citizens of Evansville, approve of borrowing \$3 million (more or less) in order to contribute toward the cost of expanding the library which would result in adding approximately one dollar (\$1.00) to the municipal mill rate if paid back over 10 years (example - \$150 per year, for 10 years, on property valued at \$150,000)?

Question 2: Should the Evansville Common Council, as the representatives of the citizens of Evansville, approve of borrowing \$3 million (more or less) in order to contribute toward the cost of expanding the library which would result in adding approximately sixty cents (\$0.60) to the municipal mill rate if paid back over 20 years (example - \$90 per year, for 20 years, on property valued at \$150,000)?

Question: Shall the Clinton Community School District, Rock and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$450,000 for the 2017-2018 school year and by an additional \$450,000 a year for each of the 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years, for a total of \$1,800,000 for the 2020-2021 school year and thereafter, for the recurring purposes consisting of maintaining reasonable class sizes, educational programming, and supporting student access to instructional technology?

RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE CAP COMMENCING WITH THE 2017-18 SCHOOL YEAR

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of Fort Atkinson, Jefferson and Rock Counties, Wisconsin, that the final school district budget beginning with the 2017-18 school year shall include amounts not to exceed \$1,750,000 each year (on a recurring basis) and \$2,250,000 each year (on a non-recurring basis for a period of three years) in excess of the revenue limits imposed by Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes for the purpose of paying District operating costs in support of delivering the quality opportunities and services each student needs to achieve his or her academic and personal potential.

Question: Shall the School Board of the School District of Fort Atkinson be authorized to exceed the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes beginning with the 2017-18 school year by amounts not to exceed \$1,750,000 each year (on a recurring basis) and \$2,250,000 each year (on a non-recurring basis for a period of three years) for the purpose of paying District operating costs in support of delivering the quality opportunities and services each student needs to achieve his or her academic and personal potential as provided in the foregoing resolution?

Question 1: Shall the School District of Milton, Rock and Jefferson Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 a year, for the 2106-2017 school year through the 2020-2021 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of ongoing educational programming, staffing and maintenance expenses?

Question 2. Shall the School District of Milton, Rock and Jefferson Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$87,000,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement program consisting of ADA accessibility requirements, safety, security and capital maintenance improvements at District facilities; additions, renovations and improvements to provide for reconfiguration of grade levels at all District schools and conversion of the current high school to the middle school; construction of a new high school with a swimming pool on land adjacent to the current high school owned by the District; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?

Question: Shall the Oregon School District, Dane, Rock and Green Counties, Wisconsin for the 2016-2017 school year and thereafter be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$1,500,000 a year, for recurring purposes consisting of paying employee compensation for teachers and other educational staff?

Question: Shall the Whitewater Unified School District, Jefferson, Rock and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$23,500,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement project consisting of district-wide building renovation and remodeling of instructional spaces, safety improvements including secured school entrances, and ADA compliance updates; construction of a new gymnasium/multipurpose room and instructional spaces at Lincoln Elementary (LINCS) and expanded physical education facility at the high school; and district-wide building infrastructure upgrades including related furnishings and fixtures, and site improvements?
