Stoughton Woman Jailed on 5th Offense OWI After 2 Vehicle Hit & Run Injury Crash

On Saturday, 02/23/19 at 1236 hours, Deputies from the Rock County Sheriff's Office, along with personnel from the City of Janesville Police & Fire Departments, responded to a report of a 2 vehicle hit & run injury crash on W. STH 11 approximately .1 of a mile west of N. Pahl Road in the Town of Janesville.

The investigation shows a red, 2005 Chevy Colorado, driven by Alanna R. Zastrow, age 34, of Stoughton, was traveling eastbound on W. STH 11 when she failed to yield for an eastbound white 2018 Chevy Traverse, driven by a 58 year old Evansville woman. Zastrow's vehicle rear ended the Traverse as it signaled, slowed and attempted to turn into a driveway in the 4700 block of W. STH 11 and continued eastbound on E. STH 11 before eventually becoming disabled in a snowbank in the north ditch near W. CTH WC.

Zastrow admitted to consuming intoxicants prior to the crash and Standardized Field Sobriety Tests administered on scene showed her abilities were impaired. Zastrow consented to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) which showed a result of .26.

Zastrow was taken into custody for 5th Offense Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated and cited for Operating While Intoxicated Causing Injury, Hit & Run Causing Injury, Operating After Revocation, Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle, and Failure to Install an Ignition Interlock Device. Zastrow was also arrested on a Probation Hold and transported to the Rock County Jail where she was held pending an initial appearance in jail court on 02/25/19 at 1500 hours.

The 58 year old woman was transported to St. Mary's Hospital in Janesville where she was expected to be treated & released for minor injuries.

Pursuant to the directive of the Wisconsin Supreme Court, as found in Supreme Court Rule 20:3.6, Trial Publicity, you are advised that a charge is merely an accusation and that a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
